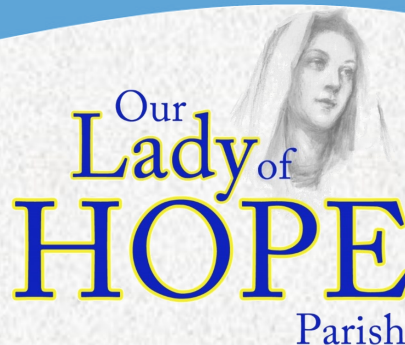

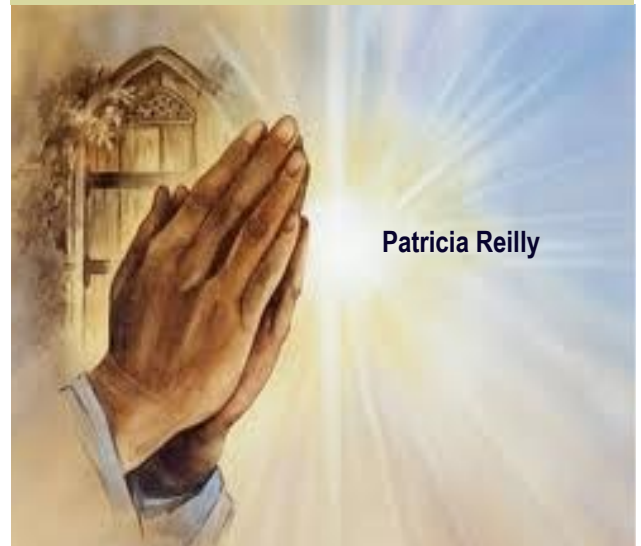

A Message from our Pastor, Rev. Joseph T. Szolack



Dear Friends in Christ,

We continue to pray for our beloved dead during the month of November. Father March celebrated a Mass to remember all those who died this past year. Death is a fact for all of us no matter how much or how little we have. Certainly death has been on the minds of so many of us as the news everyday announces how many people contracted Covid 19 and how many died from Covid complications. Death has been described as the “Great Equalizer.” It is thought by many that everyone goes to heaven when they die; it does not matter how they lived their life and what was their relationship with God. Pope Benedict XVI said so often, “They live as though there was no God.” *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1021-1022 says, “Death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ. The New Testament speaks of judgment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with his works and faith. The parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other New Testament texts speak of a final destiny of the soul – a destiny which can be different for some and for others. Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven-through purification or immediately, or immediate and everlasting damnation.” The famous quote from the movie *Braveheart* is so true, “Every man dies, not every man really lives.” How we live is essential to where we go when this life ends and how we will spend eternity. In the Catholic faith, our Church teaches us great respect for the body. When I was first ordained, a body could be cremated after death, but was not brought into the church. The Church now permits a cremated body contained in an urn to be brought into the church for a Funeral Mass. The Church teaches that cremation is licit so long as one does not disdain the body which is anointed at Baptism and Confirmation. The ashes of the cremated are not to be scattered, but are to be placed in the earth or crypt in imitation of Our Savior. We should not keep an urn in our home. I recall someone telling me that when they bought a home, they found two urns with ashes in the attic! Absolutely forbidden in our faith is the separation of the ashes of the deceased to distribute amongst loved ones or to have ashes placed in jewelry to be worn such as ear rings or in a necklace. This is becoming a trend, but it is to be avoided. This is the most vulnerable time for a family and certainly. We want to send off our dear ones with the gift of the Holy Mass which helps them to reach the place prepared for them from all time. We are blessed in our parish to have two groups that carry out beautiful ministry: the Bereavement Committee which helps the families to plan their deceased loved one’s Mass and the Grief Support Ministry who follow up and help people to get through the pain of losing a loved one through death. This entire month of November finds us celebrating votive Masses in honor of the faithful departed. It is so important to pray for the dead so that they may be cleansed in purgatory and then go before the Lord in Heaven. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. Amen. May they rest in peace. Amen. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

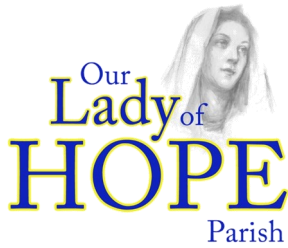
