A Message from our Pastor, Rev. Joseph T. Szolack



Dear Friends in Christ,

In the Fourteenth Century, we see the word “rigorous” arising with etymology meaning: “strict, exacting, harsh or stern.” We have now begun the intense season of Lent and I encourage all of us to embrace a very rigorous Lent. If we examine ourselves carefully, we can all find areas that are out of control and where we need the grace of God to have us change or adapt new spiritual habits. If we can identify that biggest thing in our lives now that keeps us from growing in our relationship with Christ, we need to harshly work on rooting things out and embracing that which truly reflects Christ. If we have a “light” Lent, we will hardly advance in our life with the Lord. A few prayers here and there, not examining our lives, avoiding confession of our sins, skipping Holy Mass and not giving up anything significant or embracing anything of use is going to leave us standing right where we are. The traditional Lenten trio: prayer, fasting and almsgiving should be the threefold outline for our identifying our head on, tough approach to Lent. Father Andrew Demotes said of Lent, “Fortunately for us, the church recognized from its earliest days that we would need regular periods of reflection and renewed effort if we were to free ourselves from the relentless grip of worldly cares, to imitate the example of Christ and reflect it in our lives once again. It did so by developing the season of Lent, a season which invites us to renew our concentration on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving which lie at the very heart of Christian living.” I would add something that would add to a prayerful experience during our time in the Church. Silence...holy silence. This would be a great discipline: to spend time in silent prayer, only speaking when absolutely necessary in the church once we have entered. Conversation is for the vestibule, but a week does not go by that someone asks me if there was any way we could stop the chattering in the church to facilitate prayer. I ask our ushers to keep the doors to the church closed except to allow people to enter into the Mystical Presence of God. I have written about this before, but it must be said again to protect those who come to pray and to encourage those who chat to discover the mystery of silence, holy prayer. During this time of the Renewal of our love for the Holy Eucharist, Lent is a great time to tighten our disciplines to one aim: holiness...union with the Almighty Lord. So, back to a rigorous Lent, Catherine Doherty said, “Lent is a time of going very deeply into ourselves... What is it that stands between us and God? Between us and our brothers and sisters? Between us and life, the life of the Spirit? Whatever it is, let us relentlessly tear it out, without a moment’s hesitation.”

Saint's Corner:

St. Frances of Rome: When Lorenzo Paziano of Rome married thirteen year old, Frances, everyone was in awe. Not only did he marry one of the most charming and gentle girls in Rome but one who was virtuous as well. Frances was different from other rich girls. Her mother has taught her to pray and to love the poor, as well as how to manage a large household. Though, Frances had wished to be a nun, she married Lorenzo. She dressed in the silks, velvets and jewels of the family to please her husband, who loved her dearly. She also loved him, but sometimes she longed to serve God by helping the poor. One day her sister-in-law, Vanozza found Frances crying and told her she had the same desire. Together they planned to live their married lives but also care for the poor. Often Frances and Vanozza left the palace in simple dressed and veils to care for the sick and distribute goods to the poor. Lorenzo's family was horrified when they found out. They made fun of the young women. Frances persuaded Lorenzo to let her continue to serve the needy. Frances was a good mother. When her mother-in-law died, Frances took charge of the castle. Although she spend long hours in prayer, she always saw to her family's needs first. When flood and famine crippled Rome, Frances turned her house into a hospital and distributed food and clothes. Her father-in-law was so angry he took away from her the keys to the supply rooms. He gave them back when he discovered the wine barrel and corn bin were full again after her prayers. When Rome was invaded, Frances suffered the kidnapping of her husband and the death of three of her children. Again, plague came and Frances opened her home as a hospital and drove a wagon to the countryside to collect wood for fire and herbs for medicine. Frances had an archangel as her companion. Visible only by Frances, the angel protected her. Frances formed the Sisters of the Oblates and she joined them after the death of her husband and after her children were adults. St. Frances of Rome is celebrated on her feast day March 9th.

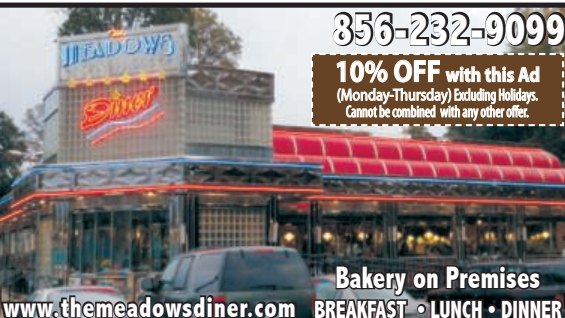

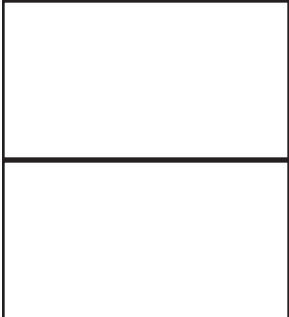
